# Exploring Social Role Valorisation with Regard to People who are Marginalised

Social Role Valorisation (SRV) helps to explain why people with disability are highly vulnerable to being excluded from everyday life.

This rich framework explores how people are marginalised, and also offers strategies to address these processes and increase the chances of people with disabilities to belong to, and contribute in our community.

In this interactive workshop the core themes and principles of SRV will be explored through presentations and discussion.

The material covered explains some of the common negative experiences of individuals and families, especially that of rejection. While this can be hard to hear, the workshop is full of ideas and strategies to make positive strides towards better lives.
