Responding Well to Students with "Challenging Behaviours"

This online workshop is being presented by Ann Greer who is a parent to two adults with disability, an ex-service manager and a highly regarded presenter. She has two decades' experience working alongside people with 'challenging behaviour".

Ann will encourage workshop participants to understand what might influence their child's behaviour at school, and how families can advocate for more positive approaches.

Topics covered will include:

- Understandings of "challenging behaviour"
- Communication and its role in behaviour what gets missed?
- Understanding approaches that are likely to assist or hinder students with disability to do better
- Avoiding punishments and developing proactive approaches
