Research clearly shows that inclusive education has strong benefits to students with disability, and access to education in your local school is supported by educational policy and international law. Nevertheless, many families find that pursuing an inclusive education can be challenging.

This workshop will help families to be clear about what inclusion should look like and will discuss the ways parents can build their advocacy and communication skills to achieve an effective partnership with a school.

For 22 years, since her son Sean was born, she has been developing her skills as an advocate, including through 12 years of school inclusion. Lisa believes strongly in the critical role of parent advocacy and the value of inclusion for all.

Karen Edwards is a local parent who has sought an inclusive life for her daughter through her primary school years and is now planning transition to high school. She will talk about how she has learnt to draw on a positive vision in her advocacy and planning.

Loren Swancutt is Head of Special Education Services at Thuringowa State High School. Her role involves the leadership and management of inclusive education experiences for all students, and the facilitation of inclusive interactions with families. Loren is also the appointed National Convenor of the School Inclusion Network for Educators (SINE) which operates under the banner of All Means All - The Australian Alliance for Inclusive Education.
